Braille is not a different language. It is a code like the Secret Code or Crack the Code worksheets we have all played as kids where a picture, or in this case braille cell, represents a letter or number.

Braille Instructional Resources

To use the braille keyboard, you must be on the home screen, on some HTML content (such as a webpage), or editing a text field. If any of these is true, turn your rotor to "braille screen input". Your device will switch to landscape mode if it is in portrait, and you can begin.

Additionally, just as the wrong wrench can ruin a nut, using poor quality Braille paper can ruin the printer's pins, print shoes and moveable parts by causing them to wear out prematurely. If your braille display has a braille keyboard, you can use it to enter text or do the following commands. The command to toggle the keyboard is Space + Dots 1-3. Use the following commands for keyboard input. Braille dots Narrator command; 1-2-3-4 or 1-2-3-4-7:

Chapter 8: Using Narrator with braille - Windows Help

First the inserting rules are applied between the beginning and the first figure "3". Here we will have a match with the last number prefix rule, i.e. the rule that inserts a number prefix (Braille symbol p3456, i.e. dots 3, 4, 5 and 6). Positioned directly above the cursor router buttons, there are eight keys similar to those on a Perkins-style braille keyboard (7). The eight braille keys from left to right are: 7, 3, 2, 1, 4, 5, 6, and 8. These keys are used to enter commands. On the front edge, directly under and in the center of the display is a SPACEBAR(8).
